*****NOTICE TO JUNK VEHICLE OWNERS*****

A new state regulation regarding automotive fluids has become effective on August 15, 1995. (see Policy Statement below)

"The party releasing the junk vehicle to the County Junk Vehicle Program must remove the fluids prior to the vehicle being hauled."

POLICY STATEMENT

EFFECTIVE AUGUST 15, 1995

"At County motor vehicle graveyards that do not have an automotive fluid removal program in place and in effect, no junk vehicle shall be accepted that contains any of the following four automotive fluids.

1. Gasoline
2. Motor Oil
3. Automatic transmission fluid or transfer case fluid in the case of four wheel drive vehicles.
4. Antifreeze

Junk vehicles containing any of these fluids may be accepted by a county motor vehicle graveyard if it has either: A) a provision in their hauling contract requiring the hauler to remove the fluids and to so certify, or
B) a fluid removal area in the yard and the fluids are removed from the vehicle prior to being placed in storage"
